Itebogeng grew up in a loving environment in Mpumalanga Masobye, where her maternal grandmother instilled in her the importance of independence, respect and kindness. She learned to stand up for herself at an early age, while her grandmother's guidance shaped her into a compassionate and determined individual.

However, her academic journey was marked by challenges, particularly in her high school years. She struggled with procrastination and lacked confidence in her abilities, often feeling overwhelmed by certain subjects. With the guidance of her teachers and mentor, she began to shift her mindset and develop strategies to overcome her academic hurdles.

When Itebogeng joined the Mqhele Yezizwe Foundation's mentorship program, she was seeking help with setting attainable goals and choosing a career path that aligned with her passions.

With the mentorship program's support, Itebogeng was able to overcome her academic challenges and achieve remarkable success.



The recognition she received during the year-end function further boosted her confidence, making her feel appreciated and valued.

Itebogeng's experience with the mentorship program taught her valuable lessons that extend beyond academics.

She learned the importance of managing time, being accountable, and not being hard on herself. She vividly recalls how the program's holistic approach not only supported their academic growth but also fostered personal development.

A key takeaway for her was the program's four pillars (Zazi, Zimisele, Zithande, Ziqhenye), which came to life through her vision board.



It served as a powerful reminder to stay focused on all areas of her life, motivated and driven to achieve her goals. She also discovered the value of teamwork and sisterhood, which helped her build strong relationships with her peers.

COMPLIANCE CORNER - NAVIGATING NPO REGULATIONS

Mqhele Yezizwe Foundation recognises the importance of strong governance and compliance practices in the non-profit sector. That's why we're committed to sharing knowledge and resources with fellow non-profits



The non-profit sector in South Africa is experiencing significant changes, driven by evolving regulatory expectations and socio-economic shifts. Here are some key trends and research findings:

Compliance and Regulatory Framework

- New Online Registration and Monitoring System: The Department of Social
 Development has introduced a new online system for NPO registration and
 compliance monitoring, strengthening oversight and compliance within the sector.
- Increased Emphasis on Anti-Money Laundering: South Africa's greylisting by the Financial Action Task Force (FATF) has led to increased scrutiny of NPOs, with a focus on preventing money laundering and terrorism financing.

Challenges and Opportunities

- **Compliance Risks:** NPOs face various compliance risks, including regulatory non-compliance, financial mismanagement, and data protection breaches.
- **Importance of Governance:** Effective governance is critical to NPO success, with a need for clear roles, responsibilities, and oversight to prevent mismanagement and reputational damage.

- Enhance Financial Controls: Implement robust financial controls, including regular audits and financial reporting

BEYOND THE STIGMA - A SAFE SPACE FOR SEXUAL HEALTH EDUCATION

In partnership with Sisonke Gender Justice, the Mqhele Yezizwe Foundation hosted a #HealthyU Sexual Health Awareness Day for Grade 11 learners at Ratlhahana Secondary School on 27 August 2025.

This initiative aimed to provide comprehensive education on sexual health, encompassing topics such as sexual responsibilities, reproductive health, sexual health risks and prevention, sexual violence and abuse and hygiene.

Young people in rural communities are disproportionately affected by sexual health issues due to limited access to information and resources. According to various studies, adolescents in rural areas are more vulnerable to unintended pregnancies and sexually transmitted infections.

By providing sexual health education, we can empower young people to make informed decisions about their health and well-being.



During the event, learners received education on various aspects of sexual health, enabling them to understand their bodies, relationships, and reproductive health.

The initiative also provided dignity packs for girls and hygiene packs for boys, ensuring that learners have access to essential resources for their health and well-being.


THE FINAL STRETCH, 20 DAYS UNTIL MATRIC EXAMS!

All the best, your hard work will pay off!




LITERACY LEAP WALKATHON
